

I USED TO HATE FATHER'S DAY...

Father's Day was just a reminder that I didn't have a dad like most fatherless individuals. Until I was in the sixth grade, I would honor my grandfather on Father's Day because he helped raise me, but he died at the beginning of my sixth-grade year.

At church, they would honor all of the "good" dads, and they should, but that made it even harder.

Hardly anyone recognized my hurt on this day because most people couldn't understand. Then one year, things changed. When I was in junior high, my youth pastor came quickly to me after church as I was trying to exit the church as fast as possible. He knew that I was upset. He had empathy. His mom died when he was a teenager, so he could understand because Mother's Day probably brought similar feelings to him. My youth pastor invited us out for lunch with his family that day. That year my perspective on Father's Day started to change.

EVERY YEAR FATHER'S DAY IS A HARD TIME IN THE US FOR THE AROUND 10 MILLION SINGLE MOMS, THE AROUND 7 MILLION GRANDPARENTS RAISING THEIR GRANDCHILDREN, AND THE WELL OVER 20 MILLION FATHERLESS CHILDREN, TEENS, AND YOUNG ADULTS.

HOW WILL YOU OR YOUR CHURCH ENCOURAGE THEM?

When Father's Day comes around, most fatherless individuals are reminded of how they have nothing to celebrate. The advertisements are everywhere: "Celebrate your dad!", "Buy your dad this or give your dad that!" When you are fatherless, you do not have a dad to celebrate. You do not have a dad to make a meal for or to take out to eat. You do not have a dad to make a card for or to write a card for. You do not have a dad to tell how much you love and are thankful for him. This is hard. There is no way around it.

Father's Day is an annual reminder of rejection and sadness to many people. But your church can encourage the fatherless this Father's Day! Your church can share the love of Christ with the fatherless families in your circle of influence!

We hope this guide gives your church fresh ideas for ministering to the fatherless families around you this coming Father's Day!

8 SIMPLE IDEAS & SUGGESTIONS!

#1

GIVE THEM A NOTE

Let them know that you care and that you are there for them through a card or a text message.

BONUS: Consider adding in a small gift card for coffee, yogurt, or ice cream!

#2

GIVE THEM A GIFT

Give them a gift or a gift bag with items that will help them as a Christian such as: music, a devotional or book, a Bible, a journal, some God is my Dad shirts, wristbands, stickers, etc.

SPEND TIME WITH THEM

Have a dinner for the fatherless in your church, at a home, or take them out to eat. Make it special!

EXAMPLE: What we have done in the past is invite them out to an Italian restaurant and order pizza. It is then a nicer atmosphere, but pizza isn't that expensive. We would then give the teens and their moms gift bags filled with special items to encourage them (see #2 above). During the meal we tried not to make them feel awkward, so we would just hang out with them and let them know during the meal that we are there for them and that we care about them. To promote the meal we would personally invite them to it. *Consider making it intimate and not a public event to keep fatherless families from feeling awkward in signing up or coming to it.


#4



BEGIN MENTORING THEM

What a great time to begin mentoring a fatherless individual in your circle of influence, they need you! We have overcomplicated mentoring. It doesn't have to be complicated. Just begin spending time with them in some capacity. You can spend time with them in person or digitally!

- **In Person:** Safely spend time with a fatherless child, teen, or young adult. Take them places with your family. Invite them into your life and be a part of their life by attending their school and significant events such as their awards, recitals, sports games, etc. Make sure to never be alone with them for their safety and for yours. There are many ways you can make this happen! If you are striving to live for God let them see you as an example in your everyday life. Don't make everything about them being fatherless, but do have hard conversations with them about their dad and about their life. Treat them like you would a friend, a son or daughter, or a brother or sister. This in person relationship is often very beneficial to the fatherless, but also for you as well.
- **Digitally:** Before Covid-19 we were already headed toward a digital age, but the pandemic seems to have fast-tracked it! If you can't mentor in person at all or all of the time consider spending time regularly with a fatherless individual through a digital platform such as Zoom, Facetime or Facebook Messenger. There are creative ways you can "hangout" digitally playing games, doing a Bible study, etc. Be creative and make it happen! Going digital may be a safer option these days anyways!

DON'T WAIT: During this Father's Day pray about how you will begin, make a plan, and share your intentions with the fatherless individuals and/or their parents if they are a minor.

#6

HELP THEIR MOMS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS

Ask them if there are any needs they have and try to help fulfill one or a few of them!

POSSIBLE WAYS TO HELP: The BEST WAY is to start a single mom support group! Some other ideas include yard work, car maintenance or repairs, groceries, tutoring their children, a meal for their family on Father's Day, occasional childcare, home repairs, etc. Learn more about starting a single mom support group: <https://www.lifefactors.org/start-a-single-mom-support-group>

MAKE NOTES A HABIT

Begin regularly encouraging these families through text messages, notes, etc. Letting them know weekly, monthly, or quarterly that you and your church are praying for them and that you care for them. Try to remember important dates such as birthdays, deaths (if their dad passed away), etc. Be creative and do what you are able, but just do something for the fatherless!

BE CLEVER
